


Black Americans make up 13% of the U.S. population, but 27% of total arrests, 32% of prisoners, and 28%

of parolees.

Communities of color are subject to higher-thanaverage rates of traffic stops, police searches, and threat or use of violence. When convicted, black residents are often subjected to **harsher than average sentences** and less likely to receive any form of reduced sentence, charge, or plea agreement, when compared to similarly situated individuals of other races. In 2021, the imprisonment rate of black males was **nearly 6 times the rate** of white males and the imprisonment rate of black females was **twice the rate** of white females.



However, states and localities must adopt proven crime-reduction practices as determined by consistent evaluation, reporting, and assessment.


