
Ministry with Correctional Officers



Inmates & COs Increase

In 13 years, the number of inmates in prisons increased by more than half of that of the corrections officers.



CORRECTIONAL OFFICERS

The risk of suicide is **39% higher** for corrections officers than all other professions combined.⁹

HALF of respondents in a 2011 survey of corrections officers reported experiencing some signs of post-traumatic stress disorder (PTSD) and an elevated risk of suicide.⁸

Correctional Officer Among the Top Ten Most Dangerous Jobs

Inmates have a higher-than-average rate of deadly diseases like Hepatitis C, the HIV virus that causes AIDS, tuberculosis (TB), and MRSA (Methicillin Resistant Staphylococcus Aureus). Inmates also typically have high rates of STDs (Sexually Transmitted Diseases), in the event that guards are sexually assaulted

Correctional officers also face:

Drug addicts coming off a high. The risk of being injured during a body or cell search.

- The risk of being blindsided by an angry inmate.
- The risks associated with transporting inmates.
- Attacks with handmade prison weapons.
- Attacks with the bare hands of inmates.
- Imagine going to work and almost everyone hates you and would like to hurt you to escape.

Other facts on Correctional Officers 33.5% of all assaults in prisons and jails are committed by inmates against staff. A CO's 58th birthday, on average, is their last. A CO will be seriously assaulted at least twice in a 20 year career.

On average a CO will live only 18 months after retirement.

Who Is Prison Mission Assn?

A Nonprofit Christian organization that provides Bible Correspondence courses at no cost to inmates in all 50 states with the goals of reaching prisoners for Christ, developing Godly leadership, and planting churches in prisons.

How Prison Mission **Association started:** In 1955, Joe Mason in Texas developed Bible correspondence courses with the goal of "Reaching prisoners for Christ"

What is PMA and others able to do to help with CO's?

It would make sense since we are already working in prisons to offer some help to the correctional officers as well. If we reach the CO they can help us reach the inmates and improve the prison system.

What is PMA and others able to do to help?

Prison culture is very volatile, violent, depressing and discouraging. There is a great need to bring hope, encouragement, and positive impact to make a difference.

What can be done to help?



1. PMA has the goal of planting churches behind bars with the help of local churches which will bring hope and positive culture in the prison which will significantly help the correctional officers.

1. Planting Prison Churches Angola Prison. It started with leadership committed with teaching moral values. Invited a Bible College to come and teach. Planted many Churches inside. It changed from one of the bloodiest to one of the safest prisons. **Rick Sharkey, Chaplain at Angola Prison**

One way that has lowered the violence and toxic environment is the example of the supermax prison in Angola, Louisiana. It was once called the bloodiest prison in America with over 6,300 inmates who were mostly all serving life sentences. It is now completely transformed.

What they did at Angola can be duplicated. Prison Mission Association (PMA) is one of the fastest growing prison ministries adding 20,000 new students in last 8 years in all 50 states. PMA has a similar vision to teach inmates through life changing Bible correspondence courses which inmates can earn college credit for completing.

How to Pray for Correctional Staff



Prayer is essential for PMA. For any prison ministry to be truly effective, it must have a solid foundation of prayer. In prayer, we call upon God for resources that He alone can provide in our battle against the spiritual forces of darkness. (Eph. 6) Paul reached the

officers in his prison (Phil 1:12-14). We also want to do all we can to help as they have one of the hardest jobs on this planet. They have the second highest mortality rate of any occupation.

1. Pray for Correctional staff and their relationship with God, that they would:

- Experience His love and kindness like never before
- Put their faith and trust in Christ's death, burial and resurrection for salvation 1 Cor. 15:3-4
- Allow God to work in them and accomplish His purpose in their life
- Earnestly seek God and get involved as He leads them in ministry

- Earnestly seek God and get involved as He leads them in ministry
- Study God's Word and complete our PMA lessons to build biblical leadership, train for ministry, and to help reach others for Christ!

2. Pray for Correctional staff to grow in godly attributes, that they would:

- Have wisdom in dealing with inmates and difficult situations
- Exhibit the fruit of the Spirit Gal. 5:22

3. Pray for Correctional staffs' relationships with their families, that they will:

- Be able to maintain a strong connection with their family, despite being under such a stressful job situation
- They have a 20% higher divorce rate than the national average
- Enroll their children the Mailbox Children's Bible correspondence courses
 - 4. Pray for Correctional staff and their relationships with Correctional officers, that they will:

- Make godly friends to support and encourage them
- Stay away from harmful associations that will lead them astray
- Be a friend to the lonely, the discouraged, and the lost
- Share their testimony so they can reach others with God's love 2 Cor.5:18-20, helping to plant churches in prisons.

5. Pray for Correctional staffs' protection, that they would:

- Resist the snares of the evil one, Satan James 4:7
- Be safe from the danger of assault and other issues
- Be healthy and free from serious illness
- They have 50% higher rate of heart disease.
- They have 10 times higher rate of Post-Traumatic Stress Disorder (PTSD) than average population

6. Pray for Correctional staff and their future, that they would:

- Be wise in the use of their God-given talents
- Seek the wisdom and resources they need to deal with trauma and stress they have every day.
- They keep positive about their future.

7. Pray that Christian Correctional staff will:

- Remain strong in their faith
- Find a volunteer mentor to encourage and disciple them
- Have strength and courage to witness to other Correctional staff
- Resist temptations and remain good role models
